**Hopewell and St. James' Settlement Collaborate to
Develop Sports Potential of Minority Intellectual Disabled Youths**

*Over HKD80,000 was Raised through the "2011 Hopewell Bowling Charity League"
Together with the Business Community for the "Strike" Bowling Program*

Hong Kong, 26 October 2011 – The 5th Hopewell Bowling Invitation League / 2011 Hopewell Bowling Charity League co-organised by the Hopewell Holdings Limited ("Hopewell", "the Group"; SEHK: 54) and Hong Kong Bowling City was held on 21 October (Friday) at the Hong Kong Bowling City in Kowloonbay International Trade & Exhibition Centre ("KITEC") with overwhelming success. A total of over HKD80,000 was raised for the "Strike" Bowling Program of St. James' Settlement ("SJS") to develop the sports potential of minority intellectual disabled youths.

The aim of the annual Hopewell bowling competition is to encourage staff members of local companies and organizations to actively participate in bowling sports and to promote work-life balance. This year's League, themed "Strike for Charity", aimed at seeking support from the business community for a charitable cause, fulfilling the responsibilities as good corporate citizens. A total of 45 teams from renowned companies and organizations joined the League to compete for the Team and Singles Events awards. A celebrity team formed by artists Mr. Leung Sze Ho, Ms. Lai Ming Si, Mr. Gilbert Lam and Hong Kong Bowling Youth Athletes Mr. Tony Wong and Ms. Victoria Chan, as well as the two "Strike" Bowling Teams were also on the alleys, truly reflecting the integration of the disable persons and the able-bodied.

CLP Power Hong Kong Limited was the Champion of the Team Event while Mr. Raymond Leung from Fountain Set (Holdings) Limited won the Singles Event Champion. With the donation from a number of participating companies, over HKD40,000 was raised through the Hopewell Bowling Charity League, together with the matching donation from Hopewell on a 1:1 basis, a total donation of over HKD80,000 was raised to fund the "Strike" Bowling Program. Shun Hing Group received the "Top Donor Award" for donating the highest amount among all companies.

Hopewell Holdings, in collaboration with their community partner, SJS, kicked off the "Strike" Bowling Program this summer to train intellectual disabled youths with the ultimate goal of training athletes to participate in the 37th Hong Kong Special Olympics. Ms. Vanessa Fung, the Hong Kong Bowling Team Representative, was appointed as the coach and Hopewell volunteers acted as training partners.

Mr. William Wong, Executive Director of Hopewell Holdings Limited said, "Through sponsoring the "Strike" Bowling Program, we are pleased to help intellectual disabled youths realise their potential. We hope to solicit continuous support from companies and organizations so that the "Strike" Bowling Program can be sustainable and on-going. In future, the Group will continue to drive corporate sustainability programs focusing on youth development."

Mrs. Cynthia Luk, Deputy Chief Executive Officer of St. James' Settlement, said, "Although intellectual disabled person has limitation on cognitive understanding, SJS believes that through providing professional training, we can help them unleash their potential. The "Strike" Bowling Program is the first bowling training program targeted at intellectual disabled youth. We hope those who have joined the program will be able to participate in international tournaments in future and bring glory to Hong Kong."

Mr. Lee Ho Leung, who completed the "Strike" Bowling Program and achieved the highest score among the intellectual disabled youths at the League, said, "My dad's encouragement made me feel more confident, that's why I performed well! When I got a "strike", not only I was delighted, the whole team cheered for me! I hope I can keep on learning bowling from Ms Fung, the coach, and will be able to participate in open competitions to gain experience in future. My target is the 2013 Hong Kong Special Olympics!"

At the same time, over the eleven years, more than 100 members have participated in training in pottery at the pottery studio, of which 33 pottery works have been demonstrated in many exhibition events. The well-known exhibition events include the “Unzipped” Ceramics Exhibition at the Pacific Place, Admiralty, in 2004; the “Ni Gao Olympics” pottery exhibitions in 2007 organized in Shanghai by the Lotte Shanghai Pottery Workshop, in reflection of the Special Olympics World Summer. The “Clay Gives Characters Pottery Gives Joy” was held in Pacific Place and Tsim Sha Tsui Harbour City in 2009 and 2010. Our members show their pure, happy, persistent from their work. Their artistic talents are widely recognized by the public.
